RESOLUTION

Approving the 2021-2022 Blackfeet Nation Fish and Wildlife Annual Hunting Regulations

No. 542-2021

WHEREAS, The Blackfeet Tribal Business Council is the duly constituted governing body within the exterior boundaries of the Blackfeet Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, The Blackfeet Tribal Business Council has been organized to represent, develop, protect and advance the views, interests and resources of the Blackfeet Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the Blackfeet Tribal Constitution and By-Laws, Article VI, Section I (p), the Blackfeet Tribal Business Council has the power and authority to promulgate regulations governing fishing, hunting, and trapping on the Blackfeet Indian Reservation. and

WHEREAS, The Blackfeet Tribal Business Council approved Ordinance # 118, entitled the Blackfeet Fish and Wildlife Code, on October 16, 2019 (Resolution No. 09-2020). and on January 7, 2021 passed Resolution No. 161-2021 approving the first amendment to Ordinance # 118, and on August 12, 2021 passed and approved the second amendment to Ordinance # 118, and

WHEREAS, The Blackfeet Fish and Wildlife Code authorizes Annual Hunting Regulations implementing regulations for Hunting, Fishing, Trapping, Recreation, and the establishment of Hunting Zones and other annual regulation determined by the Blackfeet Fish and Wildlife Department and the Blackfeet Fish and Wildlife Committee, and

WHEREAS, The Blackfeet Fish and Wildlife Commission, and the Blackfeet Tribal Business Council met several times to review the Annual Regulations and determined it was necessary to include the Ceded Strip of the Badger Two Medicine Areas as "Zone 5," to correct various inconsistencies throughout the previous Annual Regulations (such as fine amounts & Approved Hunting Zones), and to better clarify the permitted Hunting Tags, and

WHEREAS, The Blackfeet Tribal Business Council passed the 2021-2022 Annual Hunting Regulations on August 12, 2021, and provided a timeframe to begin formatting the Hunting Regulations into a booklet format for friendlier usability and continuity, and

WHEREAS, On August 30, 2021, the Blackfeet Tribal Business Council approved the final version of the 2021-2022 Annual Hunting Regulations, now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- I. That the Blackfeet Tribal Business Council hereby accepts and approves the 2021-2022 annual hunting regulations as attached hereto and incorporated into this resolution by this Reference.
2. That the Chairman or Vice-Chairman in the Chairman's absence and Secretary of the Blackfeet Tribal Business Council are hereby authorized to sign this Resolution and any other documents to effectuate the purpose of this Resolution.





Resolution No. 542-2021
Enacted: August 12, 2021

Mission Statement

The Blackfeet People are traditionally defined both historically and contemporarily by our involvement to preserve and protect the environment on a spiritual, social and cultural level. It is the mission that the traditions of the Blackfeet People for future generations, through our unique and inherent relationship with the rights regarding subsistence gathering, hunting, fishing, trapping and other related activities, will be protected and upheld to the greatest extent possible. Such promotion and preservation of these traditions shall be practiced through education, management, cooperation and research.

Sovereign Authority

*Pursuant to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Blackfeet Tribe 0.(the Blackfeet Indian Reservation, 1935, Article VI, Section 1 (p), the Blackfeet Tribal Business Council is empowered to "promulgate rules and regulations governing fishing, hunting and trapping on the Blackfeet Reservation" through the Blackfeet Nation Fish and Wildlife Code at Chapter 16 0.(the Blackfeet Law and Order Code; and, Treaties and agreements between the Blackfeet Tribe and the United States Government including all future United States Congressional Acts and United States Supreme Court case law, empowering the Blackfeet Tribe's Sovereign Right to govern hunting, fishing, trapping, **gathering fruit**, curing meat, dressing robes and all activity related to such rights whether such activity is within the exterior boundaries of the Blackfeet Reservation or in traditional hunting areas.*

**Pursuant to Blackfeet Tribal Ordinance 121,
person(s) intending to hunt, fish or recreate within
the exterior boundaries of the Blackfeet Indian
Reservation will:**

1. All hunters shall follow current regulations issued by Blackfeet Incident Command.
2. Purchase tags online at blackfeetfishandwildlife.net., or over the phone by calling the Blackfeet Fish & Wildlife Dept. at (406) 338-7207;
3. Non-Member & Non-Descendant Hunters must purchase their tags through a licensed outfitter;
4. Comply with all social-distancing, and CDC; and
5. guidelines pertaining to COVID-19., and comply with the provisions established in Blackfeet Tribal Ordinance 121.

OUTFITTER RESPONSIBILITIES

It will be the responsibility of each Outfitter to ensure that:

1. The Outfitter and the Client(s) thereof follow current CDC Guidelines and the provisions of Ordinance # 121.
2. The Outfitter must immediately notify Blackfeet Incident Command if they themselves, their client(s), or a person in their client's party shows/develops any symptoms of COVID-19, and the hunt must be postponed until incident command authorizes further activity.

Due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) the privilege to Hunt, Fish, Recreate, and otherwise participate in Blackfeet Nation Fish and Wildlife activities may be suspended without notice, by the Blackfeet Tribal Business Council. It is your responsibility to check with the Blackfeet Nation Fish and Wildlife Department for any changes/restrictions/updates.

PART I. HUNTING ZONE REGULATION

Zone 1. Boulder/Flattop Area and west side of Lower St. Mary Lake. Beginning from the community of St. Mary West to Glacier National Park Boundary continuing North to Sherburne Dam and the Many Glacier Roadway following the road to East and North across Moccasin Flat to the St. Mary River, continuing South back to the Bridge on Highway 89 on the South end of Babb Flat and following the Highway back to St. Mary.

1. **Rules:** Closed to vehicle use (no mechanized or motorized use year round). This area will be restricted to foot and/or horseback use only. Hunting season established. **Fine-\$1,000.00**
2. **Rules:** Carrying of long gun illegal; exceptions holder of Special Lottery tag and/or Non-Member Special Hunting tag. **Fine-\$1,000.00**

Zone 2. The area along the Rocky Mountain front, beginning on the North end of the North Fork Ranch road, and continues South to the roads intersection with Highway 464 Duck Lake Road, continues South into Browning and follows Highway 89 South, to the Southern boundary of the Reservation at Birch Creek. Birch Creek West to Swift Dam and running North back to the Canadian Border adjacent to Glacier National Park.

Zone 2A West. Tower Ridge, Yellow Mountain and Chief Mountain areas, North of Many Glacier Road, to Glacier National Park Boundary, West of Highway 89 and South of Highway 17.

1. Rules: Closed to motorized vehicles (including ATV's). Hunters will park at Staging Area. Restricted to foot and horseback use only, and is designated as a special hunting zone for elderly to enter by use of motorized vehicles that are not ATV's Fine-\$1,000.00

Zone 2A East. Starting at the Junction of Highway 89 and Montana 464 at St. Mary River Bridge, follow Highway 89 North to the Junction of Camp Nine Road

and follow the road East to the North Fork Ranch road to Junction of Montana 464.

1. Rules: Closed to motorized vehicles (including ATV's). Hunters will park at Staging Area. Restricted to foot and horseback use only, and is designated as a special hunting zone for elderly to enter by use of motorized vehicles that are not ATV's. Fine-\$1,000.00

Zone 3. All lands on the Eastern part of the reservation, East of the following roads: North Fork Ranch Road North straight to the Canadian Border and East of Montana 464 and Highway 89 to the Southern Boundary of the reservation.

1. Rules: Subsistence hunting is allowed after the general hunting season for the harvest of antlered Bull Elk or Whitetail Buck, closing 1 st Sunday of March through 3rd Sunday of July. No tags required, but all takes must be reported to the Department within 24 hours. Fine-\$1,000.00

* AU Bull Elk or Whitetail Bucks harvested from this area must be sampled for CWD at Designated Locations as specified on the Blackfeet Nation Fish and Wildlife Website.

Zone 4. All Lands South of BIA Route 2, (East Glacier to Heart Butte Cut-Across Road) beginning with its intersection of Highway 2 just West of East Glacier, continuing East towards the Junction of the Dog Gun Lake Road, South to the Lewis and Clark National Forest Boundary and back North to Highway 2.

1. **Rules:** Zone 4 is designated Bow hunting for Tribal Members/Descendants only. Carrying of long gun illegal; exceptions: (1) holder of Special Lottery tag; and/or (2) Enrolled Member/Descendant crossing the Reservation to access Montana Hunting District 415/Zone 5; and/or Non-Member Special Hunting tag.
Fine-\$1,000.00

Zone 5. Lands known as the "Ceded Strip" within the boundaries from North Fork to Birch Creek following the Continental Divide to the west boundary of the Blackfeet Reservation to State Highway 2.

1. **Rules:** Closed to motorized vehicles (including ATV's). Restricted to foot and horseback use only.
Fine-\$1,000.00

PART II. STAGING AREA LOCATIONS

Hunters must park at posted Staging Areas and shall either walk or ride horseback into the specific hunting zones. Hunters are restricted from driving through Staging Areas.

Zone 1: The only staging areas designated for this Zone shall be at the Iron Gate on the north end of the Lower St. Mary Lake's west shore road and the Little Canada turnout on the Many Glacier Roadway.

Zone 2: Restricted vehicles access is allowed for elders only.

Zone 2A (West):

- **Chief Mountain Road Staging Areas - Montana Highway 17:**

Across the road from Bums Sawmill, Slide Lake Road by cattle guard east of Crusher Hill Pullout and approach across from Bob Fullerton's place.

- Yellow Mountain Staging area: Kennedy Creek crossing south of fence line (near Glacier National Park boundary) and north of Tower Ridge and picnic table.
- Many Glacier Road Staging Area: Little Canada turnout and Camp 5 turnout.

Zone 2A (East):

- Duck Lake Head Bay Staging Area: West end of Duck Lake.
- Spider Lake Staging Area: Anywhere along the canal road east of Spider Lake and west of Iron Bridge crossing on St. Mary Canal.
- North Fork Road Staging Area: Near the garbage bin along the road a mile north of Duck Lake Road.

PART III. HUNTING SEASON AND LICENSING

2021-2021 Hunting Seasons and General Licensing Costs

Bow Season

Bow Season begins on the 1st Saturday of September and ends on the 2nd Friday of October.
Opening Day: September 4, 2021
Closing Day: October 8, 2021

Rifle Season

Rifle Season begins on the 2nd Saturday of October and ends on the 3rd Sunday of December.
Opening Day: October 9, 2021
Closing Day: December 19, 2021

Elderly Tribal Members

Blackfeet Tribal members over the age of 65 will receive a General Hunting Permit free of charge. Individuals claiming such permits may be allowed automobile access (no ATVs) into certain hunting zones. Pursuant to these annual regulations. If an elderly tag holder is using helpers, the helpers cannot possess firearms in Zone 2A East. The tag holder can have up to 2 helpers, they must be a Member and/or Descendant.

Tribal Member General Hunting License	Tribal Member General Hunting License Costs twenty (\$20.00). The License will authorize the take of one (either-sex) Elk, two (either-sex) Whitetail Deer, and one Mule Deer Buck with forked antlers or larger only.
Tribal Member Antelope	A Member can purchase a separate antelope license (one only) for \$5.00.
Tribal Member Spring and Fall Black Bear	A Member can purchase separate black bear license (one only) for \$5.00.
Tribal Member Gray Wolf	A Member can purchase a separate gray wolf license (limit of three per person) for \$5.00. All harvested animals must be inspected by a game warden within 24 hours of take. Trapping illegal.
Tribal Member Mtn Lion	A Member can purchase a separate mountain lion (either sex) license for \$5.00.
Tribal Member Mtn Goat	A Member can purchase a separate Mountain Goat (either sex) license for \$10.00.

Tribal Member Trapping	A Member can purchase a furbearer trapping license for \$5.00
Tribal Member Small Game	There is no cost for Members to hunt small game. Landowner permission required. Must carry Tribal I.D.

Individuals claiming such permits will be allowed vehicle access into certain hunting zones. If an elderly tag holder is using helpers the helpers cannot possess firearms in Goose Lake areal Zone 2A East. The tag holder can have up to 2 helpers. Helpers who must be a Member and/or Descendant

PART VIII. RECREATION/CONSERVATION PERMIT COST AND RECREATION ACTIVITIES

Recreation/Conservation Permit Costs. This permit allows non-members to recreate on the Blackfeet Reservation. The Blackfeet Tribal Business Council, shall restrict and/or close any area of the Reservation as needed for safety, over-use and wildlife management reasons.

A. Members and Descendants. No cost.

B. Non-Member Recreation/Conservation Permit.

The cost is \$20, which permits the user recreational access on the Blackfeet Lands.

C. Recreational Vehicle Permit Cost. The cost is \$50, which permits the user recreational vehicle use on the Blackfeet Reservation. Permit is for recreational vehicle use only on established two-track roads and landowner permission required; decal provided.

PART VIX. SPECIAL MANAGEMENT REGULATION

A. Harassing Wildlife/Antler Hunting and Gathering of Wildlife Parts.

- No person shall drive or harass any antlered animals to make antlers fall off wildlife
- No antler hunting before April 1st.
- Antler hunting is prohibited for Non-members.
- All antlers taken off reservation must have an export permit.
- All buyers, of antlers and horns, must have a Blackfeet Tribal Business License.

B. Flattop Lake and Flattop Area.

- Fishing is permitted, except during the general hunting season.
- Area closed to motorized vehicles, enter by horseback or foot only.

- No camping is permitted in this area at any time.

C. Gathering of Animal Parts .

- Only Members and Descendants can gather, retrieve or hunt antlers and/or gather wildlife parts on the Blackfeet Reservation. It shall be illegal for anyone to hunt/gather Bighorn Sheep horns or skulls on the Blackfeet Reservation.

D. Catch-and-Release and Closed Areas. The following regulations shall govern catch and release and closed areas for fishing.

1. *Cutthroat Trout*. Cutthroat Trout fishing on Midvale Creek, tributary to the Two Medicine River; and, on Wild Creek, tributary to the St. Mary River, Robert's Creek, and Lee Creek is prohibited.

2. *Feeder Canals and Waterways Season.* All feeder canals and streams flowing into the following waters shall be CLOSED to fishing from March 15 until the 3rd Saturday in May:

- Dog Gun Lake (Deep Creek)
- Four Horns Lake (entire Four Horns Feeder Canal)
- Mission Lake (Feeder Canal from the Two Medicine Main Canal to mouth)
- Kipp Lake (Feeder Canal from Willow Creek to mouth)
- Hidden Lake

3. General Hunting Season Waterway Closure. Flattop Lake and Goose Lake shall be closed to fishing during General Hunting Season.

4. CAUTION: Some Lakes may have Aerators- Open water and poor ice conditions may occur during winter months. It shall be unlawful to interfere with, retrieve or molest any BFWD net,

trap, weir, buoy, or other piece of equipment or property.

E. Chronic Wasting Notice

- The Blackfeet Fish and Wildlife Department was notified, by Montana Fish Wildlife and Parks (MFWP), that a tribal hunter harvested a whitetail deer from the Meriweather Road area which tested positive for Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD).

F. What Is Chronic Wasting Disease?

- **Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD)** is an always fatal, contagious, neurological disease affecting deer species (including reindeer), elk, and moose. It causes a characteristic spongy degeneration of the brains of infected animals resulting in emaciation, abnormal behavior, loss of bodily functions and death.

G. Hunting Regulations Pursuant to the Blackfeet Nation Fish and Wildlife Code the following activities are prohibited:

- The transporting of carcasses from areas, or states, infected with Chronic Wasting Disease;
- The transport andlor relocation of wild cervids (Deer, Elk, Moose, etc)
- All baiting and/or feeding of cervids;
- The use of cervid lures, (such as artificial game scents). **Fine \$10,000.00**

H. Hunter Responsibilities: As of the date of the passing of these annual regulations, every hunter on the Blackfeet Indian Reservation must adhere to the following .

- Stop and consent to a game inspection at every established Game Check Station
- Immediately report suspected CWD infected animals to the Blackfeet Fish and Wildlife Department. **Fine \$10,000.00**

I. What Happens if My Animal Harvested is Suspected or Believed to be Infected With CWD?

In the event that an animal harvested is suspected or believed to be infected with CWD the Blackfeet Fish and Wildlife Department will send the appropriate samples into the State Lab for confirmation .

- If it is confirmed that the harvested animal does in fact have CWD than the hunter will be furnished another tag, at no additional cost to the hunter .
- When testing has completed, the hunter may elect to keep any trophies from the infected animal; so long as the Blackfeet Fish and Wildlife Department can ensure that the CWD has been appropriately removed (disinfected) from said trophy.

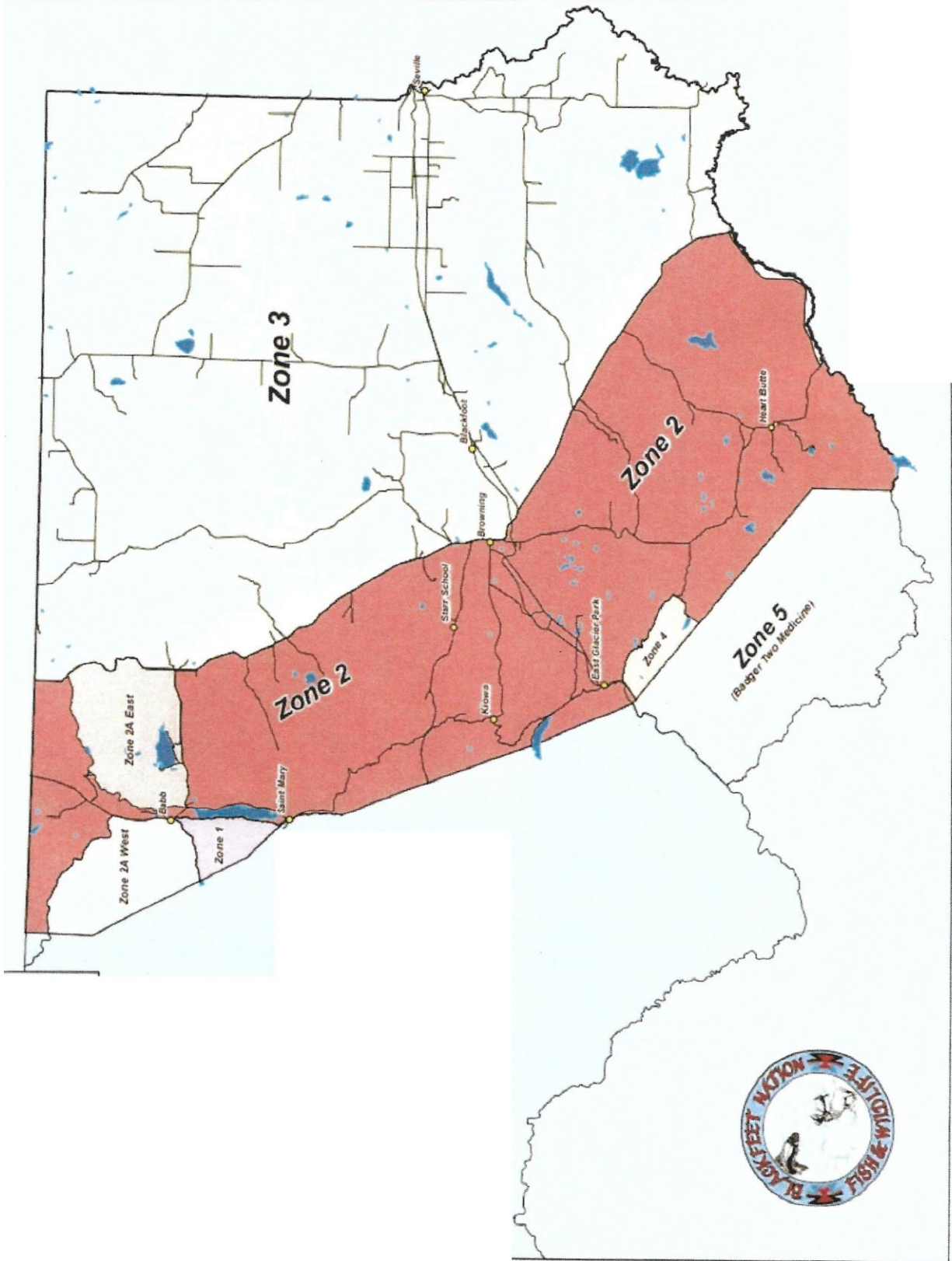

APPENDIX C. VIOLATION FINE SCHEDULE

Pursuant to the Blackfeet Nation Fish and Wildlife Code, the following list of Violations are provided in a simplified manner. For accurate definitions, rules and explanations please refer to the Blackfeet Nation Fish and Wildlife Code. Any inconsistencies between this appendix and the code will be resolved in favor of the code as written.

Criminal Violations: If a member/descendant commits any criminal offense, the Officer may elect to charge the member with a criminal violation. In addition to a criminal fine equal to the liquidated damage civil fine penalty, a member criminal violator may have imposed upon him by a Judge, a jail term of up to six (6) months. The criminal violation must be specific pursuant to Chapter 5 of the Blackfeet Law and Order Code
